

## Documentation of Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (AD/HD)

At Bard College and Bard Academy at Simon's Rock students who request accommodations for a disability may need to submit documentation to verify eligibility under Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Title 111 of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) as amended. This form is provided in the interest of assuring that evaluation reports are appropriate for documenting eligibility for students who seek accommodations and/or services on the basis of Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (AD/HD). Because the provision of reasonable accommodations is based upon assessment of the current functional limitations of the person's disability, it is in the best interest of that person to provide a recent evaluation. Comprehensive documentation of the student's disorder must be from a qualified evaluator. The following professionals generally would be considered qualified to evaluate and diagnose AD/HD: licensed psychologists, neuropsychologists, psychiatrists, and other relevantly trained medical doctors. It is not appropriate for professionals to evaluate members of their own families.
