It's a Busy Summer at Simon's Rock

This summer, we kicked off an array of <u>immersive in-person and online</u> <u>summer courses</u> for current and visiting students. And we've partnered with two Berkshire County school districts to offer area high school students access to our summer



courses, where they can receive fully transferable college credits at no cost. Additionally, our time-honored creative writing program for emerging young literary scholars—the <u>Young</u> <u>Writers Workshop</u>—gets underway this month.

Later this season, high school and early college faculty from around the country will come to campus for our Summer Institute. Professional training courses derived from models developed at Simon's Rock will range from equity practices to early college pedagogy. As ever, our focus on continued leadership and innovation in the early college space has kept our small community busy!

Legendary Early College Innovator, Dr. Pat Sharpe, Retires

Since 1983, Dr. Patricia "Pat" Sharpe, Dean of Academic Affairs and Elizabeth Blodgett Hall Chair in Literature, has been an integral emissary, steward, and exemplar of the Simon's Rock mission. Pat retires this year, and we thank her for her invaluable service to Simon's Rock and the broader Bard network.



Pat received her PhD in Literature from the University of Texas at Austin and taught in India on a Fulbright grant. She then taught at the University of Michigan for ten years before joining the Simon's Rock Literature faculty. While at Simon's Rock, Pat was instrumental in designing the curriculum and selecting the founding faculty of the first Bard High School Early Colleges in New York City, which would serve as a new format for early college pedagogy. Among her myriad contributions to our institution, Pat was notably a key contributor to our defining 2011 book, *Educating Outside the Lines*. Provost John B. Weinstein noted, "[Pat] is beloved on multiple Bard network campuses, and many educators, myself very much included, are proud to say that we were hired by Pat Sharpe."

Announcing Two New Deans in Academic Affairs

Two new positions have been created to help guide the future of academic affairs at Simon's Rock, and we are thrilled to announce that long-time faculty members will fill both roles. Kristy McMorris, former Dean of Bard Academy, is our new Dean of Studies and will provide leadership and administrative oversight of students' academic experience in both the
