Pulitzer Prize winner Tracy K. Smith announced as 2024 Book One Lecturer



GREAT BARRINGTON, MA— Text here, 12/15 Calibri with 9pt after Pulitzer Prize winner and former U.S. Poet Laureate Tracy K. Smith's poetry collection Wade in the Water has been announced as the 2024 Book One selection.

The lecture and Q&A will be held on Thursday, August 29 at 7:00 p.m. at the McConnell Theater on the Simon's Rock campus. The event is open to the public and free of charge, and will be available via livestream.

Published in 2018, Wade in the Water will be read by incoming students when they arrive at Simon's Rock.

Beginning in 2005, incoming students have participated in Book One as a common starting point for their college careers. Each year, a book is selected based on excellence and suitability for promoting interdisciplinary

conversations about the intersection of cultures. The book, lecture, and supporting materials are supplied in the hopes that it inspires discussion and exploration in students during the preliminary weeks of their First-Year Seminar.

Smith, appointed the 22nd U.S. Poet Laureate from 2017 to 2019, has written five books of poetry, one memoir titled Ordinary Light, and co-translated (with Changtai Bi) a My Name Will Grow Wide like a Tree: Selected Poems of Yi Lei, a collection of poetry by Yi Lei; Wade in the Water is her fourth collection, with the title poem harboring a melancholic tone infused with a persistent love burdened with the aches of history.

During her time as Poet Laureate, Smith spearheaded American Conversations: Celebrating Poetry in Rural Communities with the Library of Congress - which chronicled her journeys of poetic exploration in New Mexico, Kentucky, South Carolina, Alaska, South Dakota, Maine, and Louisiana through audio recordings, interviews, photography, poetry commentary, and reflections, created the American PublicMedia podcast *The Slowdown*, and edited the anthology *American Journal: Fifty Poems for Our Time*.

She is a Professor of English and of African and African American Studies at Harvard University, and a Susan S. and Kenneth L. Wallach Professor at Harvard Radcliffe Institute.

Book One Program

Inaugurated in 2005, the Book One program asks all members of the incoming class to read the first book of their college careers over the summer. Each year, a book is selected based on excellence and suitability for promoting interdisciplinary conversations about the intersection of cultures. The fall semester kicks off with a lively lecture by the author, with past writers including Alexander Chee, Gregory Pardlo, Don Mee Choi, and Simon's Rock alums Veronica Chambers '87, Prageeta Sharma '89, and Molly McCully Brown '08.

About Simon's Rock
